

Meeting in the Esarda Working Group for Training and Knowledge Management (WG TKM)

Date: 2015-10-06 at 17.00

Place: Telephone meeting in connection to the INMM/ESARDA Joint Workshop

2. Revision of the syllabus (P. Peerani)

Since the last meeting, some progression has been made:

- *Received revised module on nuclear physics by G. Maenhout*
- *First iteration on the module on NDA for spent fuel by S. Tobin and P. Jansson*

Other revised modules expected by the end of 2015: export control (Q. Michel), history (T. Jonter), legal matters (O. Jankowitch and L. Rockwood), open source and satellite imagery (VTM-wg), environmental sampling (M. Kalinowski).

3. The ESARDA strategy on Education, Training and Knowledge management; how do we proceed? (S. Grape)

This was the main reason for the meeting, but unfortunately we had no possibility to discuss the strategy itself or the process of moving ahead, as we became part of the open workshop session on education and training. Instead Sophie had to briefly describe the new strategy in broad term for a new audience that was not prepared or able to give feedback.

As a result of this, Sophie will send out the existing documentation to Jim Tuschingham and ask for help with creating a task force. The documentation to be sent are the description of the new strategy, and the document with concrete suggestions concerning tasks for the task force was written up as a result of the last TKM meeting in May 2015.

4. News of NuSaSET (S. Grape)

The Nusaset website has been updated regularly with Jobs, training courses, and student opportunities. It is being discussed to implement a live streaming software so people logged into the site can stream lectures and webinars from remote. The original idea was to provide a streaming tool for the INMM chapters who regularly have invited speakers. This way other chapter members can follow remotely the lecture INMM has been provided with the opportunity to have a webpage dedicated to their chapter on NuSaSET.

5. The TKM homepage (S. Grape)

The TKM homepage is continuously updated with information. Since May, the new document on concrete tasks for the task force has been uploaded, as have the agenda for this meeting. The meeting notes from the May are also available there. Is there any information that someone lacks?

6. Planned course activities (P. Peerani and S. Grape)

No course was given in April by SCK, but in 2016 SCK CEN will provide jointly with IRMM Geel in the framework of the FP7 GENTLE programme a 5 day course on safeguards and security.

The 2016 ESARDA course is planned for April 11-15. Call for applications is already online in the ESARDA web page.

7. Miscellaneous (all)

Regarding ESARDA YG, Riccardo Rossa has sent information that there has not been much activity since last, except a few requests to join. At the moment there are 16 active members from institutions within ESARDA and 15 external members. Riccardo will soon initiate the launch of YG activities.
